



What We Do



Vision: At the heart of mission success, across the range of military operations, are capable warriors/leaders with unique skills and tools developed at the Maneuver Support Center of Excellence, Fort Leonard Wood.

Mission: The Maneuver Support Center of Excellence develops competent leaders and warriors of character and delivers Engineer, CBRN, Military Police, and Maneuver Support capabilities to enable mission success across the range of military operations.

Enduring Priorities/Lines of Effort:

- Train skilled warriors grounded in our values and profession
- Develop agile, adaptive leaders of character
- Design, develop, integrate, communicate capabilities and concepts
- Maintain a resilient and sustainable workforce and installation



Mission Command and Integration

Training and Education

- Train ~80K military and civilians annually - 13K non-tenant USAR/ARNG
- Engineer, Chemical, Military Police, Truck Drivers, Prime Power
- Detachments from all services - 1 in 7 Marines will train here
- Credentialing for students and permanent party




