2. General.

a. The Army is committed to environmental stewardship in all actions as an integral part of its mission and to ensure sustainability. This policy supports the Army Strategy for the Environment, 1 October 2004, which presents the Army's environmental vision as sustainable operations, installations, systems, and communities enabling the Army mission. Under this strategy, the Army's environmental mission is to sustain the environment to enable the Army mission and secure the future.

b. This policy applies to all personnel entering Fort Leonard Wood or performing work for or on behalf of the installation.

3. Policy/Procedures. All organizations and activities will:

- a. Foster an ethic that takes us beyond environmental compliance to sustainability.
- b. Strengthen operational capability by reducing our environmental footprint through more sustainable practices.
- c. Meet current and future training, testing and other mission requirements by sustaining land, air, and water resources.
- d. Minimize impact and total ownership costs of systems, materiel, facilities, and operations by integrating the principles and practices of sustainability.
- e. Enhance the well being of our soldiers, civilians, families, neighbors, and communities through leadership in sustainability.

f. Use innovative technology and the principles of sustainability to meet user needs and anticipate future challenges.

g. Comply with applicable Federal, State, and local environmental laws, regulations, and executive orders.

h. Develop and implement pollution prevention and control strategies.

i. Establish environmental priorities in consideration of the benefits to the sustainment of missions and operations.

j. Strive to achieve continual improvement in overall environmental performance and supporting management systems.

k. Ensure that this policy is implemented, maintained, and communicated to all military and civilian employees and supporting contractors. In addition, this policy will be made readily available to the public upon request.

l. Ensure that all contracts and contract modifications specify that contractors are liable for any enforcement actions, fines, and/or penalties resulting from their failure to comply with applicable environmental requirements.

4. This policy supersedes any previous policies and is in effect until superseded or rescinded.
