**CHILD, YOUTH & SCHOOL (CYS) SERVICES**  
**POC: NANCY B. STARNES, 596-0200**

Children utilizing the Child Development Center (CDC) must be registered with CYS Services. The CDC is open Monday-Friday and is closed weekends and federal holidays. The full day program currently operates from 0530-1730 Monday thru Friday. The hourly care program operates from 0800-1700 Monday thru Friday. The part day preschool three-day program operates Monday, Wednesday, and Friday from 1230-1530 and Strong Beginnings operates Monday thru Friday from 0830-1130.

Children participating in Family Child Care (FCC) activities must be enrolled at a certified FCC provider's home.

**Children participating in School Age Services (SAS) activities** must be enrolled at SAS with the exception of Open Recreation that is offered two Saturdays per month. Children wishing to participate in Open Recreation must be registered with CYS Services, but are not required to be enrolled at SAS. Open Recreation is open to children from 1st thru 5th grade. Open Recreation is a free program. **The phone number for the center is 596-0239.**

**Youth participating in Pippin Youth Center (PYC) activities** must be registered with CYS Services. These activities are open to preteens and teens from 6th thru 12th grade. Youth interested in participating in any of these clubs or activities may contact the center for more information to find out about the wide variety of activities that are available and the procedures for signing up for any of the programs that they may be interested in. **The phone number for the center is 596-0209.**

Through our participation in the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) Child and Adult Care Food Program (CACFP), the CDC offers Parent's Choice Infant Formula with Lipids and Iron; available for infants through 11 months old if parents choose to participate. The CDC also offers commercially prepared infant food or ground food prepared by our kitchen staff to all children who are not yet eating table food. Infant Feeding Plans are available at the CDC to be completed to inform the staff of the food your child has been introduced to. As always, children over the age of one year will also be supplied with all of their nutritional needs while they are at the center. For more information on these programs, please contact the center.

**Deployment Discounts/Services:** Deployment Respite Care is available for children registered with CYS Services whose parent/sponsor is deployed, on TCS, PCS or TDY (90-179 days) orders or a Service Member of the deployed unit. Sixteen free hours of care is available per month, per child, during the deployment. A copy of the Service Member's orders must be provided. **The CDC opens twice a month for this service. For the month of May the center will be open on the 6<sup>th</sup> from 1200-1600 and the 18<sup>th</sup> from 1800-2200.** The normal cost of hourly care is \$4.00 per hour will apply; payment must be made in advance. A snack will be provided for the children. This service may be utilized by other patrons whose children are registered for hourly care. Reservations are required and may be made up to two weeks in advance. Care is available for children 6 weeks through the 5th grade. Due to space limitations, paid reservations may be bumped to make room for deployed Service Member's reservations. If this should occur, advance payments will be refunded.

**Family Readiness Group (FRG) childcare** is a partnering event between CYS Services and Army Community Service (ACS). There is free childcare service two nights per month for any FRG member who would like to utilize the service to attend an FRG meeting. To utilize the service your child must be registered with CYS Services and reservations must be made no later than 1200 the week before the date of the opening. **The FRG childcare dates for May will be the 3<sup>rd</sup> and the 15<sup>th</sup> from 1800-2030.**

CYS Services are also giving deployment fee discounts to children registered with CYS Services whose parent/sponsor is deployed or a Service Member of the deployed unit. Offsets to fees may be given as follows:

- 1) Waiver of CYS Services registration fee
- 2) 15% discount reduction for regularly scheduled full/part day fees
- 3) \$2.00 per hour rate beyond the free respite care hours
- 4) \$100 for team or individual sports
- 5) \$300 for SKIES Instructional Programs

To receive the discount, deployment orders must be presented to Parent Central Services upon registration, or if your child or children are already registered, you must make an appointment to rewrite your present contract and present the deployment orders at this time; however, rewriting the contract does not extend the date of your contract (it will still expire on the original date). Call 573-596-0238/0421 to inquire about eligibility for benefits.

**Parent Participation Points (PPP):** For parents with children enrolled in the CDC, SAS, or an FCC home, there are a variety of ways to earn PPP. These points can add up to a monthly 10% discount on your childcare fees. Check with your program or provider for more information on this program.

**The Skate Park is open at PYC.** The hours of operation are the same as the center, but the Skate Park closes at dusk, or 1900, whichever comes sooner. The park is open to youth 1st thru 12th grade. 1st thru 5th graders must be accompanied by a parent. All youth using the park must be registered with CYS Services and must sign in at PYC prior to using the park. Safety equipment, i.e. helmet and kneepads, is required. Some safety equipment is available at the center.

**PYC will open at 1430 on weekdays. On non-school days and Saturday, the center will open at 1200. Regular hours for the center when school is in session are Monday through Friday from 1430-1900, and on Saturday 1200-1900 for Open Recreation. The High School Lounge is open Monday thru Thursday from 1430-1900, Friday from 1430-2100, and Saturday from 1200-2200.**

**Pharmacy FAQs**

The Main Outpatient Pharmacy is now known as the Primary Care Clinic Pharmacy (PCC Pharmacy), which is located in the new north wing of the hospital.

**1. Is the PX Pharmacy the only place to pick up refills?**

No. When calling in a refill, patients have the option to choose to have their refills picked-up at either the PX pharmacy or the Primary Care Clinic Pharmacy located in the hospital.

**2. Why are changes being made to the pharmacy?**

Funds are not available to expand and remodel the PX Pharmacy. These changes have been implemented to make the best use of our staff and resources.

**3. When will refills be ready for pick-up at the PX Pharmacy?**

Refills will be ready in 24hours from the time you place the call to the refill line. Please make sure to listen to the entire recording, which will tell you when your refills will be ready for pick-up. \*Special order medications may require a longer fill time.\*

**4. When will refills be ready for pick-up at the PCC Pharmacy (in the hospital)?**

Refills will be ready in 48hours from the time you place the call to the refill line. Please make sure to listen to the entire recording, which will tell you when your refills will be ready for pick-up. \*Special order medications may require a longer fill time.\*

**5. Will my doctor be able to fax prescriptions to the PCC Pharmacy in the hospital?**

Yes. Your health care provider can fax prescriptions to: 573-596-0405.

**6. Is there parking close to the PCC Pharmacy that is located inside of the hospital?**

Good question. There are multiple handicapped parking spots available close to the building as well as regular parking spots.

**7. Is the PCC Pharmacy accessible to handicapped patients or patients with limited mobility?**

Yes. The PCC Pharmacy is located on the main entry level. It is wheelchair accessible, and wheelchairs are available at the entrance of the PCC clinic located close to the pharmacy.

**8. Will the PCC Pharmacy accept hard-copy prescriptions?**

Yes. Hardcopy off-post prescriptions, faxed prescriptions, as well as electronic prescriptions from providers at GLWACH will be accepted.

**9. What are the hours of the PX and PCC Pharmacy?**

The PX Pharmacy is open Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, and Friday 8:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. and Thursdays 9:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m.

The PCC Pharmacy is open Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, and Friday from 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m., Thursday 8:30 a.m. to 7:00 p.m., and Saturday 8:00 a.m. to noon and 1:00 p.m. to 5:00 p.m. (closed for lunch from 12:00 p.m. to 1:00 p.m.)

**Both Pharmacies are closed Sundays and all Federal Holidays.**

**10. When will all the changes be effective?**

On June 18th, the PX Pharmacy will be available for refill-pick up only. Remember, you can choose where you want to pick-up your refills. The PCC pharmacy will process new prescriptions and provide refill- pick up only if you choose the PCC Pharmacy to pick-up your refills.

**11. How do I know if I have a refill prescription or a renewal prescription?**

A refill prescription is a medication that you are already taking. In order for that prescription to be filled again the patient must call the refill phone line (573-596-0128 or 1-800-245-1953) or complete the online request form at General Leonard Wood Army Community Hospital Pharmacy's webpage to receive additional medication. [http://glwach.amedd.army.mil/patient\\_care/pharmacy/pharmacy\\_home.htm](http://glwach.amedd.army.mil/patient_care/pharmacy/pharmacy_home.htm)

Remember: A faxed prescription is not a refill prescription. A renewal prescription is usually for the same medication, but there are no refills remaining and your doctor must rewrite the prescription in order for it to be processed and filled through the system.

Remember: If you did not call the Pharmacy refill phone line (573-596-0128 or 1-800-245-1953), it is not a refill. Also, if you did not complete an on-line request form, it is not a refill.

**12. What is the prescription called when my doctor on post enters the prescription into the computer?**

When your doctor at the hospital or at Ozark Family Medical Home enters a prescription into the pharmacy computer system it can be either a new prescription or a renewal prescription. It is a new prescription if you have never taken the medication before. It is a renewal prescription if your previous prescription medication has run out of refills and your doctor has to rewrite the prescription.

Remember: If you did not call the Pharmacy refill phone line (573-596-0128 or 1-800-245-1953), it is not a refill. Also, if you did not complete an on-line request form, it is not a refill.

**13. Does the PCC Pharmacy accept call-in prescriptions?**

No.

**14. Will over-the-counter (OTC)/ self-care items still be available at both pharmacy locations after June 18th?**

No. Self-care/OTC items will only be available at the PCC Pharmacy.

**The New Primary Care Clinic Pharmacy**

The new Primary Care Clinic (PCC) Pharmacy has been outfitted with all new ScriptPro automation and technology, allowing for a faster, more efficient and safer system for processing prescriptions. While standing at the window, you may be able to catch a glimpse of the robots in action as they fill and label your prescriptions.

ScriptPro's barcode scanning technology provides verification at each step along the way and enables the prescription to be tracked throughout the entire process. The system's comprehensive database of drug records and images gives pharmacists the tools to ensure each prescription is filled correctly.

The barcode scanning, pill markings and drug images used throughout the filling and verification process provide three distinct ways to help prevent errors from occurring while filling prescriptions. Once a patient's prescriptions have been processed and sent to the ScriptPro robot, they are filled in order of receipt and collated by patient name to ensure accuracy with each patient's medication.

These are just a few of the benefits of having your prescriptions filled in the new PCC Pharmacy, where technology and pharmacy come together to help provide a quicker, more efficient and safer way for filling prescriptions.

The PCC Pharmacy is located on the first floor within the new Primary Care Clinic north wing building addition. As an added convenience, all entrances to the PCC are handicapped accessible and wheelchairs are available for use at the north PCC entrance. Also, there are ample handicapped parking spots located in the PCC north parking lot.

The pharmacy staff at General Leonard Wood Army Community Hospital strives to be a dedicated team of professionals committed to providing and continuously improving pharmaceutical care. **Water Safety:** Drowning fatalities occur annually within small bodies of water, always swim with a partner.

- ❖ Never take risks around water and only swim in areas that are supervised by a lifeguard.
- ❖ Enroll in a beginners swimming class to enhance your skills.
- ❖ Ensure required U.S. Coast Guard-approved personal flotation device (PFD) are used during your water activities, follow the rules.
- ❖ Learn basic life-saving skills, such as CPR and rescue techniques, which may be critical during an emergency and may help save a life.
- ❖ Know your limits and stay within your comfort zone.

- ❖ While boating wear a PFD device. A fall from a boat, even in shallow water could result in a head injury and result in drowning. PFDs can't protect you if they are not worn!
- ❖ Have a cell phone or some way to contact (EMS) 911 for emergencies.
- ❖ Know 1<sup>st</sup> Aid, CPR and artificial respiration.
- ❖ Never mix alcohols with boating activities, mishaps occur annually.

**Motorcycle Safety:** Motor cycles riding can be fun and extremely dangerous. Federal and state laws require completion of a MSF or other approved rider or operator safety course to operate a motorcycle on and off post.

- ❖ All operators are required to wear specific (Motor Cycle Personal Protective Equipment) when the vehicle is in operation.
- ❖ DOT approved helmets, goggles, face shield, full finger gloves, long sleeves shirts, over the ankle pants, leather boots or over the ankle study shoes, will increase your chances of protection from the elements.
- ❖ Use caution at intersections, vehicle traffic and blind spots limit your visibility.
- ❖ After passing through water, take a moment to check your brake to ensure they still function correctly.
- ❖ Ride within your skill limits and obey traffic laws. Don't ride faster or farther than your abilities can handle, constantly check the road surfaces ahead for hazards such as potholes, debris, oil, sand, animals, or vehicles .
- ❖ Operators must also be aware of and understand their motor cycle limitations and the environment.
- ❖ Motorcyclists never ride within another vehicles blind spots and use headlights during day and night operations.
- ❖ Use good judgment, after completing the course find a safe location to practice you skills, vacant parking lot, before going out on the busy streets.
- ❖ Approximately half of all fatal single-vehicle motorcycle crashes involve alcohol. Many motorcycle crashes can be attributed to a lack of basic riding skills.
