## **Seminar held at Fort Leonard Wood to advance leaders, success within the Army Profession**

**FORT LEONARD WOOD, Mo.** – The U.S. Center for the Army Profession and Ethic is scheduled to be at Fort Leonard Wood March 19 and 20 to present a new Army Profession seminar. The seminar is designed to enhance the education, training and pride of service for Army professionals.

The session will provide a one-hour overview of the Army Profession and Ethic concepts, followed by a one-hour demonstration of the CAPE professional development education and training products website.

The sessions are scheduled to take place from 6 to 8 a.m. and from 4:30 to 6:30 p.m. March 19; the final session will be conducted from 6 to 8 a.m. March 20. All sessions will be held in Fort Leonard Wood's Baker Theater and participants only need to attend one of the three sessions that are being offered. The seminars are open to all Soldiers and civilian employees on Fort Leonard Wood.

According to an Army News Service media release dated Oct. 24, 2012, the seminar was formed in response to two Army-wide surveys to assess the strengths and weaknesses of each of the essential characteristics of the profession; and five focus groups that were conducted to provide recommendations to shape the future of the profession.

“The seminars give us the ability to educate and train Soldiers and Army civilians so that they do well as members of the Army Profession,” Capt. David Davidson II, 2-10 Infantry Regiment operations officer, said.

Soldiers and civilians should attend the seminar to get updated on factors that will lead to their success within the Army Profession, he said.
