Lane, road closure slated for FLW

FORT LEONARD WOOD, Mo. – Beginning today, the northbound lane of Missouri Avenue, between Freedom Drive and North Dakota Avenue, is slated for closure from 5 p.m. to 6 a.m.

The lane will be closed to through traffic nightly, and the repair work is scheduled to be completed by 6 a.m., Friday.

Also, the Maneuver Support Center of Excellence Loop and Nebraska Avenue, between the intersection of 1st Street and Gate Street, is scheduled for closure to through traffic nightly from 5 p.m. to 6 a.m., beginning today.

This closure is in support of a project to mill and overlay MSCoE Loop and Nebraska Avenue. This work project is slated for completion by 6 a.m., June 6.

Motorists are reminded to exercise caution when traveling near these work zones.

A colonel-commanded Marine Corps Detachment and an Air Force Detachment, which are both the largest on any Army installation, are located on Fort Leonard Wood; a large Navy Seabee Detachment and elements of the Coast Guard train here as well.
