# Post to assess vehicle denial barrier

**FORT LEONARD WOOD, Mo.** – Fort Leonard Wood is scheduled to assess the Field Expedient Non-Lethal Vehicle Arresting Barrier assembly, or FENVAB, at 2 p.m. Nov. 10.

The FENVAB is used as a non-lethal enforcement barrier for limiting vehicle ramming and vehicle borne IEDs at entry control points for expeditionary and small bases where access to vehicle barrier capabilities is limited or non-existent.

This concept takes locally purchased materials, allowing soldiers to fabricate a vehicle barrier without any special tools and provides units with the ability to rapidly and efficiently increase force protection in less time and with less manpower while occupying hostile areas.
