SUBJECT: Command Policy 3, Use or Possession of Prohibited Substances

1. REFERENCES.

- a. AR 190-45, Law Enforcement Reporting, 30 March 2007.
- b. AR 600-85, The Army Substance Abuse Program, Rapid Action Revision (RAR) Issue Date: 2 December 2009.
- c. DoD Directive 1010.4, Drug and Alcohol Abuse by DoD Personnel, 3 September 1997, with Change 1, 11 January 1999.

2. GENERAL.

a. This command policy constitutes a lawful order. Violations may result in punitive action against Service members under Article 92 of the Uniform Code of Military Justice (UCMJ) and adverse administrative actions.

b. The purpose of this command policy is to establish the policy forbidding the use, possession, distribution, or purchase of substances which are intended to produce a psychotropic "high" when ingested or inhaled.

c This policy applies to—

(1) All Soldiers and Service members permanently or temporarily assigned to, attached to, or otherwise present on Fort Leonard Wood, Missouri, including Service members assigned to tenant units located on Fort Leonard Wood.

(2) Those Service members assigned to any other location over which Fort Leonard Wood has control/jurisdiction.

(3) The affected Service members at all times and all locations.

(4) All Service members within the Fort Leonard Wood area of responsibility as defined in AR 190-45.

### 3. POLICY AND PROCEDURES.

a. There is no room in the Army for the abuse of drugs or other substances that may have mind-altering effects. It presents a threat and affects the morale, discipline, health, fitness for duty, security, and safety not only of our Soldiers and civilian employees but also their families, friends, and co-workers.

b. The combat readiness of our Soldiers requires that we be healthy and well-trained, mentally and physically. Commanders and leaders at all levels will ensure that the following prohibitions are clearly understood by everyone under their charge:

(1) Soldiers may not use (inhale, inject, smoke, chew, consume, or introduce into the body in any manner to alter mood or function) any of the substances listed in paragraph 3c.

(2) Soldiers may not possess, gift, purchase (buy), offer or attempt to purchase (buy), transfer, export, manufacture, accept shipment of, attempt to ship or distribute any substance listed in paragraph 3c.

#### c. Prohibited substances.

(1) Salvia Divinorum and Salvinorin A. or any herbal blend in any form, to include any chemical composition in purported nutritional supplements (also known as [AKA] Maria Pastora, Sage of the Seers, Diviner's Sage, Sally-D, or Magic Mint).

(2) Mitragyna Speciosa Korth (AKA Kratom, Thang, Kakuam, Ketum, or Biak).

(3) Substances known as SPICE (AKA Spice Gold, Spice Silver, Spice Daimond, Yucatan Fire, PEP Spice, Fire n' Ice, Geni, and Zohai).

(4) Blue Lotus (AKA Blue Water Lily, Egyptian Lotus, or Sacred Narcotic Lily of the Nile).

(5) Concolculaceae Argyreia Nervosa(AKA Hawaiian Baby Woodrose).

(6) Amanitas Mushrooms.

(7) Datura (AKA Jimson Weed, Devil's Apple, Thorn Apple, Stinkweed, Moonflower, Malpitte, or Toloache).

(8) Absinthe.

(9) Substances known as K2 or any synthetic form of THC, chemical JWH-018, or any form to include "K2 Blonde," "K2 Summit," and "K2 Citron."

(10) Maui Hybrid or Hawaiian Haze.

(11) JWH-073 or JWH-018.

(12) 5-Meo-DMT (5-methoxy-N, N-dimethyltryptamine) (AKA Powder Mushrooms, AMT [alphamethyltryptamine], Bromo, or DMT [N, N-dimethyltryptamine]).


(13) Lysergic Acid Amide (AKA Morning Glory).

(14) Dietary supplements that are banned by the United States Food and Drug Administration.

(15) Products made from or containing hemp oil.

4. SUPERSESSON: This command policy will remain in effect until superseded or rescinded.
