SUBJECT: Command Policy 29, Storage of Issued Table of Allowance 50 (TA-50) and Valuable Items in Privately Owned Vehicles (POVs)

1. REFERENCES:

- a. Army Regulation (AR) 190-51 (Security of Unclassified Army Property [Sensitive and Nonsensitive]), 30 September 1993.
- b. AR 710-2 (Supply Policy Below the National Level), 28 March 2008.
- c. AR 735-5 (Property Accountability Policies), 10 May 2013 with Rapid Action Revision (RAR) Issue Date: 22 August 2013.
- d. AR 27-20 (Claims), 8 February 2008.

2. GENERAL:

- a. This command policy establishes policy and procedures for the U.S. Army Maneuver Support Center of Excellence (MSCoE) regarding the storage of valuable items, issued TA-50 clothing, and individual equipment in POVs.
- b. This command has experienced break-ins of POVs and POVs being left unsecure. As a result, TA-50 and other valuable items have been stolen from these vehicles. Service members are judged by their discipline, personal conduct, and—in part—by the manner in which they maintain their equipment and personal property. They must project a military image that leaves no doubt that they live by a common set of military values and uphold military order and discipline.
- c. The command has a responsibility to do all that it can to ensure that Service members live, work, and play in a safe and secure environment. This also applies to the security of a Service member's military and personal property. Service members have a personal responsibility to ensure they safeguard the government equipment they are responsible/signed for and other valuable personal property.
- d. This policy applies to all Service members assigned, attached, or tenant on Fort Leonard Wood.

SUBJECT: Command Policy 29, Storage of Organizational Clothing and Individual Equipment (OCIE) and Valuable Items in Privately Owned Vehicles (POVs)

3. POLICY AND PROCEDURES:

a. Service members are prohibited from storing TA-50 and other government owned sensitive and/or pilferable items in plain view within their POVs. This includes, but is not limited to, electronic equipment that is not permanently installed in the vehicle, tool boxes, cellular phones, computers, cameras, binoculars, hand-held two-way radios, or other pilferable items. Pilferable items are those having a ready resale value or civilian application to personal possession and, therefore, are especially subject to theft.


NOTE: This paragraph of this policy is punitive. Violators may be subject to administrative or disciplinary action under the Uniform Code of Military Justice (UCMJ).

b. Commanders will ensure that adequate and secure temporary storage is provided for Service members living off post when they are required to leave TA-50 or other pilferable government items unattended in conjunction with inspection, mission, training, or other requirements.

c. Service members, Civilians, and Families are advised to secure any personally owned high-value items and to avoid leaving them in plain view within their POVs. This includes, but is not limited to, stereo and other electronic equipment that is not permanently installed in the vehicle, wallets, purses, tool boxes, cellular phones, laptops, tablets, electronic readers, check books, and debit/credit cards. Failure to properly store or secure items in vehicles may result in noncompensable claims.
