SUBJECT: Command Policy 3, Use or Possession of Prohibited Items

1. REFERENCES.

2. GENERAL.

a. This command policy constitutes a lawful order. Violations may result in punitive action against Service Members under Article 92 of the Uniform Code of Military Justice (UCMJ) and adverse administrative actions.

b. This command policy serves three purposes: (1) To forbid the use, possession, and sale of substances that are intended to produce a psychotropic "high" when ingested or inhaled; (2) To prohibit the use, possession, and sale of drug abuse paraphernalia; and (3) To proscribe inhalant abuse (huffing) and the use, possession, and sale of inhalant abuse paraphernalia.

c. Numerous civilian jurisdictions, including the State of Missouri, have already adopted policies prohibiting the use, possession, and sale of drugs and drug abuse paraphernalia (*see Ref. (d), (e) supra*).

3. APPLICABILITY.

a. All active duty and reserve component Service Members permanently or temporarily assigned to, attached to, or otherwise present on Fort Leonard Wood, Missouri, including Service Members assigned to tenant units located on Fort Leonard

Wood, and to all civilians physically present within the limits of the Fort Leonard Wood military reservation.

b. Those Service Members assigned to any other location over which Fort Leonard Wood has control/jurisdiction.

c. The affected Service Members at all times and all locations.

d. All Service Members within the Fort Leonard Wood area of responsibility as defined in AR 190-45.

#### 4. DRUG ABUSE: POLICY AND PROCEDURES.

a. It is Fort Leonard Wood's policy to prevent and eliminate drug abuse and dependence. Such abuse and dependence is incompatible with readiness, the maintenance of high standards of performance, and military discipline. It also negatively affects the community and Families.

b. Commanders and leaders at all levels will ensure that the following prohibitions are clearly understood by Service Members under their charge:

(1) Soldiers will not use (inhale, inject, smoke, chew, consume, or introduce into the body in any manner to alter mood or function) any of the items listed in paragraph 4(c).

(2) Soldiers will not possess, gift, purchase, offer or attempt to purchase, transfer, export, manufacture, accept shipment of, attempt to ship or distribute any substance listed in paragraph 4(c).

c. Prohibited items.

(1) Salvia Divinorum and Salvinorin A or any herbal blend thereof in any form, to include any chemical composition in purported nutritional supplements (e.g. Maria Pastora, Sage of the Seers, Diviner's Sage, Sally-D, or Magic Mint).

(2) Mitragyna Speciosa Korth and any substance containing it (e.g. Kratom, Thang, Kakuam, Ketum, or Biak).

(3) Synthetic THC (e.g. Spice or K2) and any substance containing any synthetic form of THC (e.g. Spice Gold, Spice Silver, Spice Diamond, K2 Blonde, K2 Summit, K2 Citron, Yucatan Fire, PEP Spice, Fire'n'Ice, Genie, Black Mamba, Bombay Blue, Fake Weed, Bliss, Blaze, Skunk, Zohai, and Moon Rocks).

(4) Blue Lotus (also known as ("AKA") Blue Water Lily, Egyptian Lotus, or Sacred Narcotic Lily of the Nile).

(5) Concolulaceae Argyreia Nervosa (AKA Hawaiian Baby Woodrose).

(6) Amanita Muscaria mushrooms or any substance containing them.

(7) Datura (AKA Jimsonweed, Devil's Apple, Devil's Trumpet, Thorn Apple, Indian Apple, Stinkweed, Moonflower, Malpitte, Toloatzin, or Toloache).

(8) Absinthe.

(9) Maui Hybrid or Hawaiian Haze.

(10) JWH-018, JWH-073, and JWH-250.

(11) 5-MeO-DMT (5-methoxy-*N,N*-dimethyltryptamine) (AKA Powder Mushrooms, AMT (alphamethyltryptamine), or Bromo).

(12) Lysergic Acid Amide (AKA Morning Glory).

(13) Dietary supplements that are banned by the United States Food and Drug Administration.

(14) Products made from or containing hemp oil.

(15) Bath salts and plant food comprised of but not limited to mephedrone, MDPV, and methylene (e.g. Ivory Wave, Purple Wave, Vanilla Sky, Bliss, and Red Dove).

## 5. DRUG ABUSE PARAPHERNALIA: POLICY AND PROCEDURES.

a. Prohibiting drug paraphernalia aids in the command's drug abuse prevention effort by identifying suppliers, dealers, and users of dangerous drugs and by removing the equipment used to facilitate illegal drug use.

b. Soldiers will not use, possess, gift, purchase, sell, offer or attempt to purchase or sell, transfer, export, manufacture, accept shipment of, attempt to ship or distribute any item listed in paragraph 5(c).

c. Drug abuse paraphernalia entails all equipment, products, and materials of any kind that are used, intended for use, or designed for use in planting, propagating, cultivating, growing, harvesting, manufacturing, compounding, converting, producing, processing, preparing, testing, analyzing, packaging, repackaging, storing, containing, concealing, injecting, ingesting, inhaling, or otherwise introducing into the human body a substance in violation of the UCMJ (see Part IV, Punitive Articles, 37. Article 112a) or paragraph 4c of this command policy ("Prohibited Items"). This paraphernalia includes, but is not limited to:

(1) Kits used, intended for use, or designed for use in the planting, propagating, cultivating, growing, or harvesting of any Prohibited Items.

(2) Kits used, intended for use, or designed for use in manufacturing, compounding, converting, producing, processing, or preparing any Prohibited Items.

(3) Isomerization devices used, intended for use, or designed for use in increasing the potency of any Prohibited Items.

(4) Testing equipment used, intended for use, or designed for use in identifying or analyzing the strength, effectiveness, or purity of any Prohibited Item.

(5) Scales and balances used, intended for use, or designed for use in the weighing or measuring of any Prohibited Items.

(6) Diluents, dilutants, and adulterants, such as quinine hydrochloride, mannitol, mannite, dextrose and lactose, used, intended for use, or designed for use in cutting any Prohibited Items.

(7) Separation gins and sifters used, intended for use, or designed for use in removing twigs and seeds from, or in otherwise cleaning or refining, marijuana.

(8) Blenders, bowls, containers, spoons, and mixing devices used, intended for use, or designed for use in compounding any Prohibited Items.

(9) Capsules, balloons, envelopes, and other containers used, intended for use, or designed for use in packaging small quantities of any Prohibited Items.

(10) Containers and other objects used, intended for use, or designed for use in storing or concealing any Prohibited Items.

(11) Hypodermic syringes, needles, and other objects used, intended for use, or designed for use in injecting any Prohibited Items into the human body.

(12) Objects used, intended for use, or designed for use in ingesting, inhaling, or otherwise introducing marijuana, cocaine, hashish, or hashish oil into the human body, such as: metal, wooden, acrylic, glass, stone, plastic, or ceramic pipes with or without screens, permanent screens, hashish heads, or punctured metal bowls, water pipers, carburetion tubes and devices, smoking and carburetion masks, roach clips (e.g. objects used to hold burning material, such as marijuana cigarettes, that has become too small or too short to be held in the hand), miniature cocaine spoons and cocaine vials, chamber pipes, carburetor pipes, electric pipes, air-driven pipes, chillums, bongos, ice pipes, chillers.

#### 6. INHALANT ABUSE: POLICY AND PROCEDURES.

a. Inhalant abuse (huffing) is the intentional inhalation or breathing of gas, fumes, or vapors of a chemical substance or compound with the intent of inducing intoxication, excitement, or stupefaction (e.g. dullness, lethargy, marginal consciousness). Nearly all abused inhalants produce effects similar to anesthetics which slow down the body's function. The effect of inhalant abuse on the human body varies, to include stimulation, loss of inhibition, loss of consciousness, damage to the internal organs, and death.

b. The intentional inhalation or breathing of gas, fumes, or vapors of a chemical substance or compound with the intent of inducing intoxication, excitement, or stupefaction is prohibited. Furthermore, the use, possession, or sale of items intended to facilitate inhalant abuse is prohibited.

#### 7. EXCEPTIONS: This command policy does not apply to:

a. The lawful use of alcohol, tobacco, or caffeine.

b. The use of controlled substances by any person for whom they have been lawfully prescribed in accordance with applicable state and federal law, so long as such substances are used in a manner consistent with their intended medical purpose and the instructions of the prescribing physician.

c. The possession of otherwise lawful devices and substances with the intent to use them for their intended lawful purpose (i.e. in a manner that does not violate paragraph 4-2p of AR 600-85).

#### 8. SUPERSESSION: This command policy will remain in effect until superseded or rescinded.
