Regimental Command Sergeant Major (R) Charles Kirkland had an illustrious 29 year career of service to the Military Police Corps Regiment, he distinguished himself through demonstrated professionalism, excellence, and competence in every position from Private to CSM at every echelon from Company to Brigade. This faithful service and stellar career in both peacetime and combat environments culminated with his selection as the 10th Regimental Command Sergeant Major (RCSM) of the Military Police Regiment in November 2008. During his tenure 2008-2011, the Military Police Corps Regiment experienced the largest growth within the previous 30 years, the lessons learned and Tactics, Techniques, Procedures perfected over the previous 10 years of war were codified in Institutional Training and Leader Development programs, and the Military Police Regiment initiated actions to create the new 31K MOS. RCSM Kirkland's direct involvement as part of the Regimental Command team were instrumental in the success of the above actions and will contribute to the success of the Regiment well into the future.

Command Sergeant Major (R) Tony McGee had a distinguished, diverse career that spanned over 21 years. He served in every leadership position from Team Leader to Command Sergeant Major. His exceptional service from March 27, 1987- March 1, 2008 included highly critical positions that significant impact on the Regiment and its Soldiers. His dedication to the welfare of his Soldiers and their families is unmatched and positively impacted every unit in which he served. Throughout his career he developed tactics, techniques, and programs which ultimately saved the lives of Military Police men and women while serving in combat. His outstanding leadership qualities inspired his Soldiers to achieve excellence in all endeavors both in peace and war. He set an example for the Army's civilian and military leadership on a daily basis. His leadership and dedication enhanced the reputation of the Regiment throughout the United States Army. His impact as President of the National Board of Directors for the Military Police Regimental Association has been felt by Military Police Soldiers and their families around the world.

Sergeant Major (R) Gilbert Verbist served in the U.S. Army as an infantryman and Military Police Soldier from February 1948 through February 1978. He completed five tours in combat; one tour in the Republic of Korea where he participated in two combat parachute jumps and four combat tours in Vietnam. Sergeant Major Verbist holds the exclusive distinction of performing 556 static line parachute jumps in his 30 years of service. He retired from active duty on 1 March 1978, concluding his military career as the 82nd Airborne Division Provost Sergeant

Major. His love of country and enthusiasm to serve others set him apart as an influential and exemplary leader and paratrooper.

They will be inducted into the Hall of Fame on 23 September 15 at 1100 followed by a photo unveiling in the Military Police Corps Regimental Museum.
