



OPORD development is underway and will be published in December 2014.

- Soldier for Life Transition Assistance Program (SFL-TAP) replaced the Army Community Alumni Program (ACAP) and meets the guidance and requirements established by the Department of the Army.
- Two Fort Leonard Wood SFL Program Managers work with the Truman Education Center, Department of Labor and local community to connect reintegrating Service Members with apprenticeships and internships.
- Requisition for a four-year term, civilian SFL hire is approved.
- Developing memorandum of agreement for Heating, Ventilation and Air Conditioning (HVAC)/Pipe fitting training on Fort Leonard Wood.
- Developing memorandum of agreement for Automotive Technician training programs through Central Texas College along with assistance from FMWR.

VA Sharing Agreement Concept

The Inpatient Agreement:

- With Harry S. Truman Memorial Veteran's Administration Hospital, Columbia, Missouri
- Signed 08 SEP 14
- As of 14 NOV 14, GLWACH has seen 18 VA beneficiaries as inpatients

The Outpatient Agreement:

- With Harry S. Truman Memorial Veteran's Administration Hospital, Columbia, Missouri
- Signed on 17 OCT 14
- First patient referred to Podiatry on 07 NOV 14.
- Agreement includes care for the following categories: podiatry, optometry, ophthalmology, women's health, ENT.

Potential to expand the number of agreements we have in place

State of Resources



- 2015 training load and budget projections are similar to prior years
- Decrements from prior years:
 - 4th Maneuver Enhancement Brigade. Prior reductions totaled ~1,000; have absorbed the majority of those cuts. Remainder to be completed before end of FY15.
 - The civilian surplus placement program is working, and we have placed about 50% (107 out of 216) of those in the program – across all FLW enterprise partners - in permanent positions, but must be diligent and place the remainder.

Army perspective for FY15 and FY16:

- The Army will have reduced ~110K personnel by the end of FY15 (to 490K AC/ 350K ARNG/ 202K USAR); reducing any faster will place the All-Volunteer Force at risk.
- “If sequestration returns in '16, another round of indiscriminate cuts will gut our force to the point that we'll be unable to meet the strategic guidance.” (SECARMY)
