CSM (Retired) RICHARD C. MORRIS

FORT LEONARD WOOD RETIREE OF THE YEAR



CSM Morris entered the United States Army on June 23, 1983. During his 23 year career he served in every leadership position from Team Leader to Command Sergeant Major along with several specialized positions of tremendous importance and responsibility. In all of his Army assignments Rick found success at every level of responsibility. His impact on the Soldiers, Civilians, and Families whom he served are legendary. Several examples will follow. From 1999 to 2003, then First Sergeant Morris helped move and stand up the Military Police School from Fort McClellan, Alabama to Fort Leonard Wood, Missouri. His leadership made a real difference during this difficult move. From 2004 to 2005 Rick also served at Fort Leonard Wood as the

Command Sergeant Major of the 342nd Military Police Battalion (PROV). During both Fort Leonard Wood assignments, Rick was very active in numerous civilian and military organizations to include serving as the Fort Leonard Wood Sergeant Audie Murphy Club (SAMC) Vice President and later as President. The SAMC is an organization that serves Service Members and Families on the installation and in the community and this very select organization is made up of only the Army's best senior Noncommissioned Officers. He also organized and activated the first Military Police Regimental Association Chapter.

His Army awards and decorations are numerous and include a Legion of Merit, a Bronze Star Medal, 7 awards of the Meritorious Service Medal, 5 awards of the Army Commendation Medal, 8 awards of the Army Achievement Medal, the Military Outstanding Volunteer Service Medal, the Combat Action Badge, the Basic Parachutist Badge, the Air Assault Badge, the Gold Recruiter's Badge (3 Sapphire Stars), the German Armed Forces Efficiency Badge (Gold), the German Armed Forces Marksmanship Badge (Bronze), and the Military Police Corps Order of the Marechausee in Bronze. Rick is a member of the Army's prestigious Sergeant Audie Murphy Club and the Sergeant Morales Club Member. His last Army assignment was a combat tour in Afghanistan with the 716th Military Police Battalion, 101st Air Assault Division, Fort Campbell, KY. Mr. Morris retired from the United States Army on October 1, 2006 after serving as a distinguished, multi-faceted professional Army Noncommissioned Officer for over 23 years.

In his second career, Rick is the Director of Operations for Fort Wood Hotels by Ehrhardt Properties, a hotel franchise company with other real estate investments headquartered in St Robert, MO. Rick leads the day to day operations of this award winning Hospitality Company. In this industry, Rick has earned the title of Certified Hotel Administrator (CHA) and he is a 2009 Graduate of the Emory Executive Education, Global Leadership Institute, Emory University, Atlanta, GA. Rick is the past President of the Fort Leonard Wood/Mid-Missouri Chapter of the Association of the United States Army. Rick served on the Rolla, MO City Council (Ward 5) for one term from April 2007 to April 2009. He also served as the Chairman of the Phelps for the Fort (the Rolla Area Military Affairs Committee). Rick is a member of the Board of Directors of the Pulaski County Growth Alliance (PCGA), the Pulaski County Rotary Club and Rotary International, Chairman of the Pulaski County Tourism Board, the Waynesville-St Robert Chamber of Commerce, the Veteran's of Foreign Wars (VFW), and the Military Police Regimental Association (MPRA). He is the Chairman of the Committee of Fifty (a group of prominent community members who support Fort Leonard Wood and its service member's retirees, and Families).

Rick and his family, wife Audrey (AJ) and son Jake, reside in Waynesville, MO.

RETIREE APPRECIATION DAYS SEPTEMBER 9, 10, 2016



Robert B. Flowers, PE **Lieutenant General (Retired)**

Lieutenant General Flowers has served in the private sector since retiring from the Army in 2004. Most recently he served as SVP and Director of Federal Programs for ARCADIS. He organized the Federal Program and developed and implemented a plan to significantly grow federal business in the company. Over year growth from 2011 to 2013 was 30%. General Flowers served in L--□3 LSG as the Senior Vice President, General Manager, International and Special Programs Office and was the Senior Vice President for L--□3 International & Commercial Enterprise. He led in the development of large project management services comprising complex, infrastructure and urban development projects.

Retiring from the U.S. Army after 35 years, he was selected to head HNTB Federal Services Corporation in July 2004. As CEO of the new company, he developed the strategic plan to guide the firm in addressing the government's facility, infrastructure and security needs. In 2007, HNTB Federal Services expanded its leadership team to better serve the growing global infrastructure market by naming LTG Flowers as vice chairman of HNTB Federal Services and chief executive officer of HNTB International Corporation. In this position he directed the growth of Federal Services and International programs from \$8 Million per year to over \$120 million per year. He created an integrated business strategy that resulted in profit, growth and clear direction for not only HNTB Federal Services and International, but all the HNTB companies.

As Chief of Engineers and Commander, US Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) he led an organization of 37,000 personnel in managing and executing engineering, construction and real estate programs for the US Army, Air Force and other federal agencies and foreign governments. He directed the execution of a worldwide \$15.5 billion per year program of engineering and construction services in over 90 countries and began the \$20 billion program for reconstruction in Iraq and Afghanistan. He worked closely with the State Department and country teams to aid developing countries, building infrastructure and developing water resources.

Prior to his selection as the Chief of Engineers, he served as the Commanding General of the Maneuver Support Center and Fort Leonard Wood. His other commands include an engineer company in Germany; the 307th Engineer Battalion, 82nd Airborne Division; the 20th Engineer Brigade, XVIII Corps (Airborne); and the Mississippi Valley Division of the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers.

He holds a Bachelor's Degree in civil engineering from VMI, a Master's Degree in civil engineering from the University of Virginia and is a registered Professional Engineer. He also attended the Senior Engineer Executive Program at Stanford University.

Lieutenant General Flowers is a Fellow and past National President of the Society of Military Engineers. He was one of the authors of the Civil Engineer Vision 2025, a roadmap for the profession. He is also Chairman of the Civil Engineering Advisory Board for the United States Military Academy at West Point. In 1996 General Flowers was nominated by President Clinton and confirmed by the Senate to serve as President of the Mississippi River commission. He has published numerous articles on infrastructure and government service and has been interviewed on numerous news and talk shows including CNN, Fox, and Bloomberg. He is a frequent guest speaker at National Leadership Conferences.

Among the honors he has received are: Gold deFlury for lifetime contributions to the engineering profession (2008); American Society of Civil Engineers OPAL award for Lifetime Achievement in Public Service (2003); two awards created by the engineer community in his honor

(1) Robert B. Flowers Sapper Leader Award given annually by American Engineer Association at the Engineer Conference; (2) Robert B. Flowers Small Business Award given annually by SAME at the Society of Military Engineers Conference.

IDENTIFICATION (ID) CARD FACILITY

The ID Card Facility is located in Dillard Hall, Building 470, at 13486 Replacement Avenue, 2d Floor, Room 2101. Hours of Operation are 7:00 a.m. – 11:30 a.m., 12:30-4:00 p.m., on Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, and Friday and 7:00 a.m. – 12:00 p.m. on Thursday. The Facility is closed on holidays. Appointments can be made by accessing the RAPIDS Appointment Scheduler at <https://rapids-appointments.dmdc.osd.mil/>. Customers without computer access may call the ID Card Facility for an appointment at 573-596-0744. Services for walk-in customers are limited, but those walk-in customers with emergency needs will be accepted on a case-by-case basis during hours of operation. In honor of our nation's retirees, on Saturday, September 10, 2016, from 9:00 a.m. to 12:00 a.m., the ID Card Facility will be open for retiree customers. Customers must have two valid forms of ID, one must be a photo ID. For initial enrollment of dependents, the following documents are needed: original or certified marriage certificate, birth certificate, divorce decree, retirement orders/DD Form 214, and a SSN card for dependent children.

JUDGE ADVOCATE GENERAL

The Fort Leonard Wood Legal Assistance Office is open M, T, W, and F from 8-4, but closed from 1200-1300 for lunch and the afternoon of the first Friday of every month. Will briefs explaining wills, living wills, and powers of attorney (both health care and financial) are held weekly on every Wednesday morning. Legal Assistance will offer to prepare and execute estate planning documents in one day after attending the will brief. Items and information necessary to complete a will in one visit: (1) military ID card (2) Names, addresses, and phone numbers for your agents, executors and guardians, if applicable (3) List of personal property to be distributed (4) addresses for all real property (5) Other specified arrangements. If you do not have all the required information, the personnel at legal assistance will ask that you take the questionnaire home for completion and return it to the office. Non-will related powers of attorney can be taken care of at any time during normal business hours. Call the Legal Assistance Office at 573-596-0629 for more information, or visit their Web site at www.wood.army.mil/sja/. The Legal Assistance Office is located in Building 315 at 316 Missouri Avenue. One-day will service will not be available at Nutter Field House on Retiree Appreciation Day, but legal assistance will be available.




