We are writing to inform you that your Soldier has been assigned to the 31st Engineer Battalion at Fort Leonard Wood, Missouri for one of the following: Basic combat training for approximately 9 weeks, combat engineer advanced individual training for approximately 5 weeks, or initial entry training for approximately 14 weeks. Upon successful completion of all training and graduation requirements, your loved one will graduate as a Soldier, U.S. Army Engineer, or a fully-qualified Engineer Soldier.

Soldiers here undergo a comprehensive program of instruction designed to train them both physically and mentally. They become proficient in many combat-oriented tasks, and they learn to live the Army Values: Leadership, Duty, Respect, Selfless Service, Honor, Integrity, and Personal Courage. The training here is quite challenging for our new Soldiers, many of whom are away from home for the first time. However, our Noncommissioned Officers are among the finest in the Army and have been specially selected and rigorously trained to serve as Drill Sergeants. Our Drill Sergeants take pride in developing the young men and women entrusted to us, for most will return to the operational Army after their 2-3 year tour here and will see many of these Soldiers again. We are confident that our training programs work, and we will continue to ensure your Soldier is trained to the highest standards.

Our primary focus is training; therefore we discourage visits and phone calls home will be limited during the training cycle as they are distractions to the Soldiers. However, we do encourage you to write to your Soldier as often as you like. Your letters of encouragement can provide additional motivation and inspiration during the tougher days of training.
