

Frequently Asked Questions:

My unit is activating. Where can I gather historical information on the unit? Lineage and Honors?

While some MP unit information is held at military police archives, other sources include the Center of Military History, which is the office responsible for determining lineage and honors. You can check their website <http://www.army.mil/cmh-pg> or contact their assigned [points of contact](#) for each branch.

Where can I find replacement streamers or guidons?

Per the Army's Institute of Heraldry web-site "After the organization receives the authorization letter for the coat of arms, a requisition (DD Form 1348-6 Manual) for the flag may be submitted to the [Clothing and Heraldry Office](#) in Philadelphia."

I need to get copies of my military police course transcripts. Could you send copies of my course rosters?

Military Police course transcripts requests should be made to the US Army Military Police School academic records section at: atsjs@wood.army.mil

Copies of course rosters or class members will not be provided in accordance with the Department of Defense's privacy program.

I would like more information on a crime/incident that occurred while I was in the military.

The military police archives usually does not maintain records of this nature and inquiries should be made to the Criminal Investigation Division's records branch at: mailcicr@belvoir.army.mil
